Index for the years 1978 to 2012? The "Hawaiian Koa" is indigenous to Hawaii. It does not grow anywhere else in the world and only 10% of the Koa tree

forest remaines. The Honolulu Festival Foundation is supporting the Koa tree planting project on the lands that once belonged to the Kamehameha Kingdom

One Koa tree can absorb almost the same amount of carbon dioxide in which a family of four would have exhaled during a 7-day vacation trip in Hawaii; Two Koa trees can produce the amount of oxygen needed for a family of four for one year.

The Honolulu Festival Foundation will be supporting the Koa tree planting project to protect the global environment.
